

Our Checklist to track progress for Best Practices 2022-2023



We have been monitoring our progress toward the Best Practices Award in this ABWA year, which runs from August 1st through July 31st. Our goal was to advance to the Level I award, but, due to low recruitment, we believe we have dropped to Level III. Our binder will be shipped to ABWA by July 31, 2023.

- By June 30, 2022, submit to ABWA National:
- ☑ Names of officers for 2022-2023 (four required).
- ☑ All officer positions are filled (four).
- ☑ \$125 chapter liability insurance fee.
- ☑ Website listing: Must meet branding standards and have required elements (links).
- ☑ Submit names of committee chairs to ABWA by August 15, 2022.
- ☑ File 990-N tax return for 2021-2022 by December 15, 2022.
- By July 31, 2023:
- Have at least 30 members in good standing (national and local dues paid). We currently have 35 members, and the determination date is July 31, 2023 (30 members for Level III).
- ☑ Recruit at least 6 new members.
- ☑ Officers and committee chairs in good standing (dues paid).

ANNUAL PLANNING:

- Have a minimum of 10 members complete the Member Interest Survey (we had 18).
- Create a Vision Statement and put it on the Community Connections Team Board.

EXECUTIVE BOARD ITEMS:

- ☑ Complete a chapter GAP Analysis.
- ☑ Create an Annual Business Plan w/Competitor Analysis.
- Create an Executive Summary (part of plan).
- Create action items (Key Results Areas / KRA's).
- ALL CHAPTER MEMBERS:
- ☑ Vote to approve the annual budget.
- ☑ Vote to approve the league's Standing Rules.
- ☑ Vote on ABWA's Proud Code of Conduct.
- ☑ Vote on ABWA's Core Values.

ANNUAL CURRICULUM:

- ☑ Structured networking opportunity before, during, or after each monthly meeting.
- ☑ Minimum of nine professional development programs (speakers at meetings). *We had ten.*
- ☑ League representative attended a Just In Time Webinar hosted by ABWA National.
- Annual training session on how to access league resources, how to update Community Connections profile, and how to register for courses in the Apex Campus.
- Sponsor 7 primary members to attend a regional or national conference.
- ☑ Organized at least one fundraising event.
- MEMBER AND LEAGUE RECOGNITION:
- ☑ Selected a 2022-2023 Woman of the Year.
- ☑ Nominated a Top Ten candidate.
- ☑ Recognized at least one Protégé recipient (July).
- ☑ Two members present at the 2023 National Women's Leadership conference to accept the Best Practices Award.

- ☑ Published and distributed a minimum of 4 newsletters.

Southfield SOURCE - July 2023 Learn how to spot and red

Learn how to spot and report phishing attempts. Also be cautious of business authentication-related emails containing a QR code. Think before you scan and/or click. Be cautious of emails requesting personal or sensitive information. Implement phish-resistant MFA (Multi-Factor Authentication) for your accounts to prevent unauthorized access through stolen credentials. Verify the contents of the QR code by taking a screenshot of the code and uploading it to https://scangr.org/ to have it quickly analyzed by a free,

A new phishing technique has been observed in multiple credential phishing emails that contain malicious QR codes (quick-response codes).

Watch out for QR Code Phishing scams

QR codes are two-dimensional barcodes that can be scanned by a smartphone camera to quickly and easily access information or a website. They are commonly used in advertising, on business cards, at restaurants for menus, and for contactless payments. However, threat actors may alter the original QR code and link it to a credential harvesting login portal, or to malware that automatically installs on the user's device as soon as they open the link via a QR code scan.

This poses a significantly higher risk because users may not have a way of knowing where the QR code will take them until they scan it and may not be able to verify the authenticity of the link. This makes it easier for threat actors to trick users into unknowingly downloading malware or giving away their login credentials.
