Proceeds will be used to fund the \$1,000 Bettie Archer Johnson Scholarship at Madonna University and to fund scholarships and grants through the ABWA Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund (SBMEF). Novi Oaks also offers a Business Skills Tuition Reimbursement program and provides funds for members to attend regional and national ABWA conferences.

In 2022, as always, our members and guest hostesses created fantastic table decorations, which added to the fun for this morning event (see pictures below). Each table is hosted by a friend or member in a theme of her choice. Seeing the decorations is half the fun! An additional table in her favorite Elvis theme was hosted by Carol Ann Donnelly.

#### Our Checklist to track progress for Best Practices 2022-2023



We will be monitoring our progress toward the Best Practices Award in this ABWA year, which runs from August 1st through July 31st. In 2021-2022, we qualified for the Level II award. Our goal is to advance to the Level I award, and to do that, we need at least 50 members and must have recruited 10 new members since August 1st.

- By June 30, 2022, submit to ABWA National:
- ☑ Names of officers for 2022-2023 (four required).
- All officer positions are filled (four).
- \$125 chapter liability insurance fee.
- Website listing: Must meet branding standards and have required elements (links).
- $\square$ Submit names of committee chairs to ABWA by August 15,
- ☑ File 990-N tax return for 2021-2022 by <u>December 15, 2022</u>.
- By July 31, 2023:
- ☐ Have at least 50 members in good standing (national and local dues paid). We currently have 42 members, but the determination date is July 31, 2023 (50 members for Level I).
  - NOTE: It is recommended that members whose memberships renew in July pay dues early, and by July 29 at the latest.
- ☐ Recruit at least 10 new members. We currently have two.
- Officers and committee chairs in good standing.

#### ANNUAL PLANNING:

- ☑ Have a minimum of 10 members complete the Member Interest Survey (we had 18).
- Create a Vision Statement and put it on the Community Connections Team Board.

#### **EXECUTIVE BOARD ITEMS:**

- ☑ Complete a chapter GAP Analysis.
- ☐ Create an Annual Business Plan w/Competitor Analysis.
- ☐ Create an Executive Summary (part of plan).
- ☐ Create action items (Key Results Areas / KRA's).

#### ALL CHAPTER MEMBERS:

- ☑ Vote to approve the annual budget.
- Vote to approve the league's Standing Rules.
- Vote on ABWA's Proud Code of Conduct.
